Bring'n'Brag

The Bring 'n' Brag contest for June was held in conjunction with the monthly meeting at the Hickory Community Center in Hickory, PA. This month's contest category was Cranes and Derricks and eight entries were received.

First Place went to Jim Kubanick for his HO scale South Allegheny Wreck Crane #3400. Jim's crane was built from the Gould/Tichy plastic kit with added details including spot lights, backup light, whistle, boom tie rods, and cab curtains. The tender gondola was built from a Scotia Scale Models wooden kit and included many added detail parts representing the tools and rigging necessary for a wreck train. Finally Jim painted, lettered and weathered both the crane and gondola.

Second place voting resulted in a three way tie between Robert Hickman, Grier Kuehn, and Bill DeFoe. Bob brought in both HO scale and N scale telescoping cranes built from Kibri kits. Greir entered an HO scale Scrap Yard Crane built from a Walthers kit. He added separate details and a scratchbuilt lifting magnet and painted and lettered the model for Chartiers Iron and Metal Co. Bill entered an HO scale steam crane built from a Jordan Products kit.

Bill removed the side panels from the model to reveal the interior details

Other entries for last month's contest included:

Steve Raque entered an HO scale steam shovel built from the same Jordan Products kit entered by Bill DeFoe but with the shovel replaced by a Sheepscot brass crane boom kit. Keith DeVault entered an HO scale wreck crane built from an Athearn kit including replacement couplers and a gondola boom tender. Steve Hertzer entered an O gauge freight station built from a Korber kit. Steve scratch built the loading dock and added gutters and both interior and exterior lighting. Don Reed entered an HO scale scratchbuilt Boat Building and Repair Shop. Don built the structure board by board over cardstock subwalls.

Thanks to everyone who entered models and voted. The next contest will be held as part of the annual summer picnic in August. Next month's category is "Work in Progress" so bring out all those things you can't seem to finish!




Located at intersection of Ferry St. and PA 65 (Ohio River Blvd.)


Parking: Plenty.
