February's Bring 'n' Brag contest was held at the monthly meeting hosted by the Western PA Model Railroad Museum in Gibsonia, PA. The theme of this month's contest was "Intermodal Equipment" and 4 entries were submitted.

Joe Lofland's HO Scale model of a PRR flat car won first place after receiving 12 of the 33 votes cast and counted. He started with a Bowser kit which was kitbashed with a large number of extra details. Joe received an extra point for kitbashing.

Second place was won by Bill DeFoe with 10 votes for his HO scale flat car and trailer (below, right). Bill started with a Varney sheet metal car from the 1950's which he lowered and added a wooden deck to. His van trailer was built from a Quality Craft wood kit. Bill received an extra point for kitbashing of his models.

Third place was won by Larry Kline with 7 votes received for his collection of three O scale Western Maryland cabooses (below, left). His model of Cabin Number 1801 was built from a Central Hobby Supply resin kit. He replaced the running boards, trucks and wire handrails on

Other entries for this month's contest included:






