Vagel Keller (412) 441-7881 vckeller@comcast.net organization in general. It is always challenging to hold one of these conventions near the geographic limits of our region, which is why we have to work so hard in Pittsburgh. They did a good job. Here are a few of my observations.

First, regarding clinics: the overall theme of the convention this year was on operations, uniting varied talks and workshops on layout design, use of timetables, basic operations, prototype practice, and related issues. One of the most enjoyable clinics for me covered the subject of shelf layouts, small switching layouts that can keep several people busy for an extended period of time if planned well and operated in a manner that simulates the prototype. No, I'm not talking about the famous (infamous?) "time saver," which is more of a switching puzzle than a trackplan imitating a prototype. Shelf layouts have been around for a long time, but interest in prototypically-planned layouts seems to be on the rise, perhaps as we realize we have time for building only so much of a mainline.

Many of the illustrations were from track plans in the Kalmbach annual publication on layout design, but most were from the British magazine Railway Modeler, which I recommend to anybody interested in this kind of layout, as well as intrigued by detailed modeling in limited space to a fairly high standard (not ridiculously high, however.) I've enjoyed reading this magazine for more than a decade; while editor of the *Keystone Flyer*, I often picked up a copy at the Borders bookstore near South Hills Village mall after dropping off the flyer at the Northside bulk mail center. Alas, the bookstore is gone, but now I have a subscription.

Regarding layouts—I visited seven in one day—I noticed that all used dcc systems for control, although they varied in brand. All of the layouts were built to a high standard and had reached a high level of completion. Most were freelance, with perhaps a core appearance in equipment and scenery corresponding to an actual railroad. However, one of the simplest but most impressive layouts is based on a terminal along the PRR. The overall scheme is basically a long oval, one side devoted to the terminal,

including passenger and freight stations and additional switching locations, and the other side to staging. In talking with the owner, it was clear that he regularly holds operating sessions, whci are challenging even on a layout that probably sounds from what I've written as very simple. He also remarked that the layout design and operating scheme is much like those for layouts appearing in Railway Modeler, the second reference to that magazine and layout design philosophy I heard during the convention.

Next year, no regional convention will be held as our region hosts the national convention in Cleveland. I'm already looking at my schedule.

May's Bring 'n' Brag contest was held at the Altoona Association of Model Railroader's in Altoona, PA. The theme for this month's contest was 'Maintenance of Way Equipment' and there were three entries.

Dom Candelore won First Place for his O-Scale MOW train garnering 12 of the 21 votes cast. His train included two Atlas boxcars, an X-29 and an X-26, which he weathered, two flatcars, one from a Westbrook kit which was extensively retrofitted with new brake rigging stirrups and trucks and the second car scratchbuilt from basswood and brass on a Westbrook centersill, a MTH Burro crane converted from 3-rail to 2-rail with new trucks and couplers, and an Aux Fuel tender reworked from a Max Gray Imports K-4. Rounding out the train he included two Weaver Models Troop Sleepers and a Gems Models B-6 Switcher.

With 8 votes received, John Ainsworth won Second Place with his set of MOW equipment. All of his models were scratchbuilt from plans published in 'Model Railroader Magazine.' His crane represented a Link-Belt railroad crane built in the 1920's, and was made entirely from brass excepting the trucks and couplers. The Boom car is based on plans for a PRR F30e and was also made from brass except for the wooden deck. Finally his Rail and Tie car was built from plans in an article in the October 1968 issue based on a Canadian National prototype. Third Place was won by Bob Hickman for his UP Rotary Snow Plow Train in HO scale. Bob used a Walther's Alco Rotary Snow plow with an Atlas NREGenset engine.

Thanks to everyone who brought in models and voted. Next month's contest category is "Off-Line Structures."



After making all required moves, a mere 5 seconds separated first and second place! The third place team did not complete all moves before running out of time.


