From the Super's Desk Schoolhouse

The Mid-Central region is selling laser kits of an actual schoolhouse in Canal Winchester, Ohio. I brought several back from the region board of directors meet in Columbus a couple of months ago and

put them in our Company Store, keeping one for myself. Over Thanksgiving I started to assemble it and have a few suggestions for others owning the kit or thinking of buying one.


The kit goes together pretty easily. In general I am following the instruction. There are places where I am making small modifications to the construction and in one case the design to bring it closer to the prototype in appearance.

I like a strong structure with very straight walls, sharp rightangle corners, and a solid foundation for details such as windows, trim and roofing. I braced thoroughly with 1/8" square stripwood along the base and top of each wall. Even though the walls are made from fairly thin but stiff plywood, when I glued the walls together they had a little wave to them until I added bracing. No matter how precise the subwalls are cut out through the laser process, the tabs can stick out very slightly so that the styrene brick overlay cannot lie absolutely flat, so I used an emery board to smooth each wall at all four corners until silky smooth.

I used canopy glue to bond the thin styrene overlays on the subwalls for the sides, then used my emery board to make sure the ends were flush with the end walls, then glued on the front and back. The end walls are slightly wide, which allowed me to carefully trim them flush with the sides. The result was a very square corner with no gap.

For some reason the windows in the front facade are about one scale foot too high. I could not convince myself to leave them


alone as being "good enough." I cut about a scale foot off the bottom of the overlay, carefully cut an equal amount from the bottom of each window opening in the plywood



subwall, and glued the overlay this same distance below the top of the wall. The gap will be covered by trim. The trim supplied is a little too narrow to cover the gap; I'll dip into my lumberyard of scale stripwood for 1×12 .

The roof fits on the four walls accurately and firmly, held in place by two tabs on each end wall. There was no provision for filling the v-shaped valley where the two roof pieces meet.

I used stripwood to fill the space, followed by sanding with the emery board

Minutes

The meeting was convened at 2:30 p.m. by Superintendent Hohn, at the New Eagle Volunteer Fire Department. He thanked the Mid-Mon Valley RR Club for hosting the meeting. There were approximately 34 members present.

There were no new members in attendance, but there was one guest: Grier Kuehn brought his grandson, Vinny.

The minutes of the previous meeting, as published in the Keystone Flyer, were approved by consensus.

Reports

Editor of the *Keystone Flyer*: There was no report as the editor was not present. No one knew of any issues and everyone got their *Flyer* on time.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Carl Volkwein reported that slightly less came in than his last report. We remain solvent. Book sales from the Company Store brought in \$992 and \$79 from "Pass the Hat. This is Carl's last meeting as Treasurer. He is retiring as of the 1st of January. Jeff Greg has volunteered to be Carl's replacement. The Superintendent expressed the thanks of the Division for Carl's many years of service. That was followed by a round of applause.

<u>Company Store</u>: Jerry Kyslinger reported that 40 books had been sold as part of the "Fire Sale". Therefore, the size of the Company Store is decreasing making it easier to transport. Send Jerry an email if there are any new books you desire.

Jerry also took the opportunity to announce that the program to display the Free-Mo modules with the Methodist Church fell through due to lack of participation. Perhaps the S Gaugers can fill their requirements. The application for the Greenberg Show in February has been submitted. They are looking for more modules to increase the size of the railroad and make it more fun to operate. Charley Blenko has volunteered to help.

Switching to another of Jerry's many hats, he pointed out that elections for Division officers are approaching. Anyone interested in running for office should contact Jerry or Carl Volkwein.

<u>Programs</u>: January's meeting will be at the Ohio Valley Lines in Ambridge, as in past years. February's meeting will be in Gibsonia, also as in the recent past. Today's presentation will be on motor cars.

<u>Membership & Web Site</u>: Membership is down to 233 members. We have one new member, Bill Powers. It seems there are some "dormant" members that have failed to renew their membership but continue to attend meetings. He will follow up with those people. The NMRA does not send numerous reminders as some magazines do. There was some discussion on how to remind those members who are in arrears. The Superintendent pointed out that all officers must be current members of the NMRA. This was not the case in some divisions.

The Committee to create a new display for the Division stated that they would like to copy the one that was displayed at the National in Portland. The Superintendent displayed several pictures on his phone.

Tom Gaus is still working on improving the web site.

Tom stated that we are one of the few divisions that still provide only a print version of their bulletin. We will have to go to a digital version eventually. We will no longer be able to

provide a print version to our non-digital members. We have tried to be considerate of those who don't have a computer, but they are a distinct minority. It was also pointed out that we must have paper versions of election ballots. We will have to find a way to accommodate the election process.

The Superintendant took the opportunity to thank members who fill in while functions are open. From his trips to the MCR meetings, he believes we are one of the best organized divisions.

Grier Kuehn reported that a fourth contest has been added to the photo contests. The use of Photoshop to improve one's pictures was discussed. No decision was reached. Grier pointed out that this is not an NMRA contest. The winners are selected by popular vote. There is no judging.

Steve and Cynthia Priest are the after dinner speakers as well as giving a clinic. Cynthia is the editor of the NMRA magazine and her husband Steve works for Railroad Model Craftsman. They should be very interesting.

There are plenty of flyers to pass out for the Jamboree. Please take them to local hobby shops as well as train shows. There is a show in Washington on 5 January as well as a show in Adamsburg on 10 January.

If you're attending, mail your application to Tom Gaus. All the open houses on Sunday following the Jamboree will be listed on the web site.

The Superintendent announced that our monthly meetings should be more of an "event" instead of just a "meeting", per direction from the National. Having "events' is expected to increase attendance. We still need meetings to make decisions. Some divisions are run by "executive committee". A lengthy discussion followed. The general consensus was that we should continue having "meetings" to make decisions in a transparent manner as well as provide a venue for camaraderie.

It was pointed out that if you are an active NMRA member, their insurance covers your home layout.

to make the ridge flush with the roof.


The chimney is a little too big for the hole provided in the roof, so I enlarged the opening. To provide a place attach the chimney securely, I built a little platform across the opening.

I am not quite done with the kit. This week I constructed most of the cupola. I had a lot of trouble getting the four pieces for the cupola roof to fit. No problem: I simply filled the gaps the same way I did the main roof.

I painted the brick with raw sienna acrylic paint picked up from our local Michael's. This color is a match to the former PollyScale "Rust" that I read long ago is a good representation of old brick. I've decided to go with a green trim.

I'm not quite finished with my model and will report any more

modifications in the future. So far this has been a fun kit and I only offer this information to encourage you to buy one yourself.


