Minutes From Last Meeting

The first meeting of 2009 was called to order at 2:33 PM, in the McKeesport Model RR Club building in McKeesport, PA. From where I was sitting it was difficult to get an accurate count, but there were at least 34 members present. Susan thanked our hosts. Club president, Dean Liberty, gave a brief history of the club and their future plans. The layout is twenty years old and the wiring at least ten. As constructed, the track layout is primarily a display route with no provisions for realistic operation. Their plan is to save the structures, but rebuild the entire layout starting from the top of the benchwork. The new plan will feature trackwork for a bridgeline operating scheme and DCC control.

George Pandelios a former Pittsburgher and friend of Neal Schorr's traveled from Hummelstown (Hershey), PA to visit and display his model. Andy Blenko introduced his two non-railfan children, Stephanie and Evan.

The November meeting minutes were approved as published in the January Flyer.

Carl Volkwein had phoned Susan the Treasurer's report. Income was \$1725, largely from the Company Store, and expenses were \$1838, largely Company Store purchases. There was a net loss of \$112 this period.

Dick Flock gave the Company Store update. There are four of the PRR flatcar books left and Dick will likely not restock since there is a large minimum order. The new Montour book is very good. This is authored by Gene Schaeffer, one of our Jamboree clinicians. There are still some PRRH&TS Conemaugh Division books left and one Intermountain FGE reefer model. There are also a number of Sylvan Models trucks and trailers. Dick still has a collection of southern states barn (or sign) decals to unload, as well as prototypical supermarket decals made for the City Classics kit. He can get the MCR laser cut PRR passenger shelter kits, as well as the new Region project for the Ashtabula, OH Engine Crew Locker Room kit as featured in the Kingpin.

Tom Gaus announced that our Division has 249 active members, with 7 who just signed up in December and January. In December the website had 21,313 hits and 1255 sessions. The Links page was the most viewed. Tom is also the Jamboree Registrar, and to date six people have signed up.

Bob Meier noted that the Freemo module group could not get space at the Greenberg show, February 7-8, at the Laurel Highlands Events Center in Greensburg. They are third on the waiting list for just a membership table. Reduced space at this facility means that some dealers are waiting as well. New modules are still welcome and wanted by the group.

The campus building were we previously met is being renovated, but the industrial mural in the lecture hall was saved and relocated.

Dennis Vaccaro gave the Achievement Program report. There have been a number of member inquiries and a certificate is on its way.

Susan had a box of flyers available to advertise for the 2009 Jamboree. Jim Sacco has lined up a broad range of clinics and the dinner speaker will be Brian Butko, historian and author. Brian will present "Roadside America" showing the common and uncommon sites that lined our streets and highways in the '40s and '50s. The Jamboree admission had been held to the same price as last year, despite cost increases. Registrations up until March 8 are discounted, after that date add an additional \$5. Third place was a tie between Andy Blenko and Charles Scheider. Charlie Blenko entered an HO scale Athearn SD45-2 factory painted for Conrail with a DC/DCC decoder with sound. Charles Scheider entered two Atlas O Scale boxcars. They included an X29 painted and lettered for the for the PRR and an Atlas Trainman lettered for the Maine Central. Both cars were heavily weathered to match prototype photos.

Keith DeVault entered an HO scale covered hopper lettered for the B&O/Chessie built from an Acurail kit. Keith added metal wheels and Kadee couplers, additional decals and weathering were applied to obtain the effect of a modern graffiti covered car.


A limted number of copies of the PRRT&HS books on PRR flatcars and the Conemaugh Division are still available.
