August's Bring 'n' Brag contest was held at the annual Division 2 summer picnic at Henley Park in Leetsdale, PA. This month's contest category was "Works in Progress" and nine entries were submitted.

First place went to Dave Wilson for his HO scale PRR Engine Facility. Dave included models of a coaling tower built from a Gloor Craft Kit, and Ash Conveyor built from a photo etched brass kit, a Tichy Water Column, and a scratchbuilt turntable.

Second place was won by Steve Hertzer for his O scale Feed Mill. Steve started with a Walther's kit to which he has added details and is in the process of detailing the interior.

Third place was won by Steve Ross for his G scale passenger coach. He is rebuilding the observation end of the coach to include picture windows and rearranged seating. He will also need to relocate the lavatory and pot belly stove.

Other entries for this month's contest included:

- A long retaining wall made from individual cut stones also entered by Dave Wilson

- A series of layout photographs by Grier Kuehn showing work in progress on his home layout.

- Jim Whipple entered an S scale panel side gondola car being built from a 'Western S Gauge' kit from the 1980's. The kit is mostly balsa wood and cardboard, He has the floor, one end, and one side completed.

- Bill DeFoe entered a scratch built coaling tower he is building from plans he found in several of the 1951 and 1952 issues of Model Railroader Magazine. Amazingly it looked a lot like the tower Dave Wilson built from a Gloor Craft Kit.

STEUBENVILLE / WEIRTON / WHEELING LAYOUTS

1. **PRR Panhandle Division.** Doug Day, 106E Meridian Green, Wintersville, OH, (740) 275-4108. Doug's HO-Scale 9 x 7-ft L-shape switching layout depicts the PRR Lines West in 1957. The mainline is 16-ft long, with a minimum radius of 24" and No. 6 minimum turnouts. Scenery is 20%. Train control is by Digitraxx Digital Command Control (DCC). On Fernwood Rd. proceed for approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and turn left onto Meridian Green. Go to the first full intersection and turn left into the parking area. Apartment will be on the left. Enter through the main door.

2. **Ohio & West Virginia RR.** Les Lemley, Kings Drive, Steubenville, OH, (740) 282-7858. Les's 50 x 28-ft HO-Scale layout depicts the prototype B&O and the freelance O&WV between Charleston, WV and Cleveland, OH in the mid-1950s. Minimum radius on the 350-ft mainline is 30", with No. 6 minimum turnouts. Scenery is based on foam and hard-shell. Train control is by Northcoast Engineering DCC. On OH Rt 213 travel approx. 3 miles to Pleasant Hill Vol. Fire Dept. (on right). Just past the firehouse turn left onto 16 Ridge Rd. Go $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to 1st intersection. Turn right; 1st house on left. Enter house through door adjacent to parking area with the basketball hoop and descend stairs to layout.

3. Arel & Jolene RR. Joel Everly, 812 Broadway Blvd, Steubenville, OH, (740) 282-9854. Joel's HO-Scale layout depicts the Central Division of a Class I bridge route between St. Louis and Baltimore and is freelanced with PRR, Nickel Plate, and W&LE influences. The 35 x 22-ft double deck layout, with a 300-ft mainline, runs around the room with a peninsula. Scenery is 10%. Train control is by Northcoast Engineering DCC. The layout is in the 3d house on the right in the 3d full block from the intersection of Broadway and Sunset Blvid. Enter through the garage.


4. **Buffalo Creek & West Virginia RR.** Harry Crouch, 712 Federal St, Toronto, OH, (740) 537-3276. Harry's On30 freelance model railroad is set in southern West Virginia during the 1930s and 40s. The 26 x 33-ft double deck layout supports a 100-ft mainline. Scenery is about 10% complete. Train control is by Northcoast Engineering DCC and operations are point-to-point with switching of coal and lumber industries. Follow OH Rt 7 approx. 8 miles to the Franklin St. exit in Toronto. Turn right from the exit, travel to "T" intersection; turn left onto Franklin. Go to next traffic light; turn right onto Federal. Enter through the side door, turn left down to the layout.

5. **Ravenswood, Spencer & Glenville RR.** Jack Keen, 111 Murphy, Weirton, WV, (704) 748-6993. Jack's HO-Scale model railroad represents the B&O from Ravenswood to Spencer in central West Virginia in the mid-1940s; motive power is steam only. The 22 x 12-ft double deck L-shaped layout features a 70-ft single track mainline. Scenery is partially complete. Train control is by DC. In Weirton, turn right onto 11th Street and travel 1-1/4 miles. At the top of the hill (past Weir High School) turn sharp left onto Murphy Ave. Layout is in shed behind the 5th house on the left. A limited number can view the layout at one time, so take turns.

6. **Bethany & West Liberty RR.** Bud Scroggins, 221 Brookview Dr, Follansbee, WV, (304) 527-1265. Bud's HO-Scale model railroad is a freelanced PRR & NYC branchline set in West Virginia's northern panhandle during the 1950s and 60s. The 11 x 20-ft layout is built for continuous around-the-wall running, and features a scale mile of double-track mainline. Scenery is under construction. Train control is by Digitraxx DCC. On WV Rt. 2, when just past the steel coke works on the right, turn left onto Mahan Ln. Take it to the top of the hill (2 miles). At stop sign, turn right onto Eldersville Rd. Travel one mile to Brookview Dr. on left. Turn left, follow road to layout in house on left. Enter through front door. Enter through front door.

7. Cleveland, Lorain & Wheeling RR. Arley Mitchell, 143 Jane Dr., Wellsburg, WV, (304) 242-1148. Arley's HO-Scale model railroad depicts the Chessie System between Benwood, WV and Cleveland, OH from 1960 through 1987. The 24 x 24-ft layout is built on two to three levels of open grid benchwork supporting a point-to-point 125-ft double track mainline. Scenery is in the early stages. Train control is by Northcoast Engineering DCC. Layout is in 4th house on left. Parking is plentiful. Go around back on the right side of the house and use either the small door or the large sliding door.

8. **Baltimore & Ohio Mountain Sub.** Alden McBee, 4 Kenwood Place, Wheeling, WV, 304-242-1148. Alden's HO-scale model railroad represents the B&O between Grafton and Terra Alta, WV under the Chessie System during 1978. The double-deck layout supports a 4-scale mile point-to-point double track mainline with a 2.6% maximum grade. Scenery is still in the planning stages but will be foam and hardshell. On US 40 East, go past WV Rt 88 and you'll see Advance Auto on the right. Plan to turn left onto Heiskel Ave. It is on a sharp and blind curve, so do be cautious making the turn. Proceed past 2 stop signs. Garage on right, just after 2d stop is 4 Kenwood Place. Enter through gates, up the driveway; turn left to enter basement door.




MAP TO THE OCTOBER 18, 2009 MEETING

Traveling NORTH from Pittsburgh on I-79: Take Warrendale exit #75 (formerly exit 23) on I-79 Northbound. At the end of the exit ramp, turn LEFT onto Warrendale-Baye Road (the "Red Belt"). Travel approximately 1 mile to a fork in the road and take the RIGHT turn onto Pleasant Hill Road. The Municipal Building is on the right, just past the first bend.

Traveling SOUTH from Butler on I-79: Take Cranberry exit #78 (formerly exit 25) on I-79 Southbound. At the end of the exit ramp, turn RIGHT onto Route 228. At the first traffic light turn LEFT onto Route 19 South. Continue on 19 South to the 4th traffic light (intersection with the "Red Belt"). Turn RIGHT at this light onto Warrendale-Bayne Road. Continue approximately 2 miles, passing the I-79 entrance, to a fork in the road; take the RIGHT turn onto Pleasant Hill Road. The Municipal Building is on the right, just past the first bend.
