



The Waynesburg & Washington in On3 A New Keystone Division Layout


Fred Abrew's On3 layout will be open to Keystone Division members and their guests before and after the November 20, 2011 meeting. It depicts the prototype Waynesburg and Washington Railroad, a narrow gauge short line that ran between its two namesake towns in southwestern Pennsylvania, ca. 1905. The W&W was in almost constant financial trouble. It became a subsidiary to the Pennsylvania Railroad in the late 1800's primarily to capture the right-of-way for access to coalfields near the southern terminus in Waynesburg.

Layout design began in 2006, when Fred developed a conceptual drawing using 3rd Planit, which he believes was "the best layout software out there" at the time. Since then he has made "almost daily, certainly weekly progress," he says. Because he most enjoys building, the railroad is much more about challenging his modeling skills and less about running trains. He has hand-laid 232 feet of code 83 track, including numerous dual gauge turnouts, two turn tables, and two stub-end yards, with Washington having an interchange with the standard gauge Chartiers Valley branch of the PRR. Fred has also scratch-built several structures and pieces of

rolling stock, including models of passenger cars from Jackson and Sharp, a 19th-century car builder that supplied rolling stock to many narrow gauge lines in Pennsylvania. Scenery is as it might have appeared in 1900, not today: most of the hillsides were denuded of trees with firewood being a very important resource, so there are not tremendous amounts of trees on the layout. There is still work to be done in Washington, with the beautiful Washington Station still a dream.

Operation is essentially point-to-point the same way the prototype was operated, with three passing sidings that allow for meets. Operations, like on the prototype, are not extensive. Train control is by block, with two cabs, DC throttles feature momentum and braking. Turnouts are all electrically powered with Switchmaster machines. All bench work and trackage is complete; scenery is approximately 85% complete. "All in all," says Fred, "I am pleased with the layout but continue to work on improvements almost every day."
