# From the Super's Desk

Doomed Projects

Last month I wrote about those projects whose completion seems to recede slowly into the distance, while new projects are added to the "to be finished" list. This month I want to write about projects that will never complete. They range from large to small,

and from the "ran out of steam" to the "never should have left the station."

For instance, I planned my Auburn depot as a two-story building with the passenger facilities on the first floor and offices on the second, with a one-story wing as the freight house. This was a very common configuration at important cities, and also conformed to the depot footprint on an 1880's Sanborn map I found on the web. I used as a model a wood frame station of similar age on the Southern Central in Owego, NY, changing the construction to brick.

I highballed out of the station with this model, and had

Now I knew the freight house was separate from the passenger depot; not only that, it was a wood frame building. Fortunately, I had yet to join the two sections of my station. so now I have a partially-complete model of a brick freight house with no place to go.

I own a book contained two pictures of a New York Central track running on a short trestle along one bank of a creek in the city of Auburn for a distance of hundreds if not thousands of feet. An earlier Sanborn map shows this line running along a city street from the NYC yard and mainline to an important thrasher-manufacturing firm. Seems clear that the railroad moved the track from the street to the only option available in a densely-populated urban area, a creek bed.

What an interesting and unusual scene! I decided to model it even though it was not on the Southern Central RR. I built benchwork, started to mock up buildings, bought a turnout, and started arranging structures to get a picture of what the scene would look like. Then I stopped. Something was not right, and after looking at my progress or lack of it over a period of months, I decided the project was doomed. It just was not going to look right, and I finally figured out that I had not allocated enough space: only 8 feet instead of the 15 or 20 that would do it justice. I'm not sure I will ever complete it now.

On an even larger scale is the layout torn down before complete. Perhaps the modeler's goals have changed, more information has come to light, or boredom sets in. We've all probably been there before. My first layout after getting back to model railroading did not get very far, although I learned a lot in the meantime. My next layout got much further, and my current one just keeps developing.

Meanwhile, here's my progress on the five projects I wrote about last month:

- 1. B & O tower at Rowlesburg: none
- 2. Southern Central Passenger depot: finished painting canopy brackets
  - 3. Coal trestle: zip
- 4. Two Grand Trunk boxcars for the home layout: now, where did I put them?
- 5. Auburn Freight house: almost complete; largely down to shingles on roof; it's a large roof, so this will take a while.

And remember, I started a new project, an early signal tower at a crossing. This one is closest to be complete, requiring only a simple foundation and Campbell shingles on the very small roof.

# Bring'n'Brag

September's Bring 'n' Brag contest was held at The Schiappa Public Library in Steubenville, OH. The contest model theme this month was Tank Cars and four entries were submitted.

First place voting resulted in a tie between Larry Kline and John Ainsworth with 7 votes received for each of their entries out of the 20 total votes cast. Larry entered a set of three O scale tank cars all painted and lettered for Gulf Oil Company. Cars numbered SHPX 5776 and GRCX 3746 were Atlas O models while car GATX 15572 was scratch built. John entered an HO scale J&L Tank Car for Tar. His car was built from a 1 ¼ inch wood dowel, wrapped in styrene, and detailed with Micro-Mark rivet decals. The frame was built from styrene while the remaining parts were made from brass

Third place was won by Dom Candelore with 6 vote received for his On3 scratchbuilt East Broad Top tank car. Dom made the basic tank out of PVC pipe couplers which he turned down on his lathe to get the correct diameter. He overlayed the tank with 10 mil styrene to which he had embossed rivet in prior to assembly. The frame was made from basswood with brass strips for stirrup steps and stanchions. He used trucks were from San Juan and Kadee couplers in PSC pockets.

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


