I think it was NMRA President Charley Getz who commented on the fast rate that Bob Brown, editor of the Narrow Gauge and Short Line Gazette is able to model; I cannot remember if it was speed in kit-construction or scratchbuilding, but it's all pretty much the same. If you've seen Bob Brown's layout in the magazines or in person, you know what an accomplished modeler he is, so his speed is not carelessness or cutting corners.

I find the kind of rapid-but-effective modeling hard to imagine and even more difficult to achieve. I tend to go off in too many directions and burn out pretty quickly on any one project. I guess that explains why I do multiple projects almost simultaneously.

How can focused, sustained modeling be achieved? Perhaps working to a deadline helps. When I get an assignment at work, one of the first things I ask is "when is it due?" Not to procrastinate, but rather because like many, I work best to deadline.

Practice no doubt helps. I know when I'm working on a model and finishing a step, I'll be thinking about the next step. If I have built similar models before, I can go seamlessly from one step to the next without having to think about a new skill, what tools I'll need, whether I have the raw materials, and the most efficient way to get the job done. Maybe I even have a jig from making an earlier model that will speed up the task.

A tolerance for mistakes is important—as long as they are not too major. "Mistakes" might be the wrong word; willingness to try something and tear it apart to try again might be important. Again, as long as the changes are not extensive.

Probably most important is a clear vision of the final goal. Certainly, kits are relatively fast to build because we have a picture and plan of the result to be attained. The

# Bring'n'Brag

October's Bring 'n' Brag contest was held at The Norwin Public Library in Irwin, PA. The theme of this month's contest was 'Interlocking/Switch/Yard Towers,' and there were four contest entries consisting of seven separate models.

First place went to John Ainsworth for his two scratchbuilt HO scale Santa Fe Hump Yard Towers. John's models received 19 of the 31 votes cast. Both models were based on articles published in 'Model Railroader Magazine' in 1957 and 1958. The shell of Tower A was made from Basswood with brick siding printed from Paperbrick.Co.Uk. The rest of the structure was fabricated from styrene. The interior of the tower has many details including a bathroom. Tower B which represents a retarder tower was built entirely from styrene excepting the extra fine sandpaper used to simulate the roofing paper.

Second place was won with 6 votes by Larry Kline for his scratchbuilt HO scale YM Tower. His model which was built in 1958 represents a tower he used to frequent on the Reading Railroad.

Mike Hohn's models received 4 votes to win third place with his two scratchbuilt HO scale towers. The first model represents a B&O tower located in Rowlesburg, WV circa 1955. His second model was

of a Southern Central 1880's Crossing Tower. Both structures were built of wood.

The only other entry this month was Dick Flock's two versions of the HO scale Model Power Plastic tower kit. The first was built exactly as designed, while the second was kitbashed with a new roof, downspouts and smokestack.

Thanks to everyone who brought in models and voted. November's Bring n' Brag contest category is "Plants and Trees," and will be held at the next meeting in New Eagle, PA.


