RETURN TO IN-PERSON MEETINGS

Bring'n'Brag

June 2021

Hello, fellow NMRA Keystone members. Allow me to introduce myself. My name is Rick Terek and I'm the other half of the Bring and Brag committee, along with Tracy Boyd. Tracy is off traveling the big blue skies, so she asked me to cover the report this month. As for me, I got into modeling about 6 years ago and model in O scale. I don't have a layout per se, but I do model in diorama.

Here are the results for the June Bring and Brag contest:

Coming in at **first place** is the HO buffer car by Grier Kuehn (top right). He describes his model this way:

Nobody ever said a working car had to look pretty and this ex-Santa Fe 2-bay cement hopper is no exception. The boys in the shop patched it out and from the looks of it were none too careful. The new reporting marks and numbers are awfully sloppy. Oh well, that's because they just grabbed a can of white paint and brushed them on.... The hopper was built from a Walthers kit with metal wheelsets and Kadees added. It was patched out and then heavily weathered, turning the bright Santa Fe red rather brownish and dingy... just the way a buffer car should look.

Coming in **second place** was this Weirton Steel caboose by George Pandelios (left). He describes his model like


Steel mill rolling stock are some of the dirtiest and most poorly maintained equipment on rails. Sloppy or no paint jobs, high heat, and exposure to corrosive agents are all part of a day's work. [Here] is Weirton Steel (WSX) caboose #4, a Pennsy N5 originally acquired for its scrap value but converted to slag run service. It was used on the end of slag car trains for the 3-mile run between the blast furnaces and the dump at Standard Slag. The model started out as an O scale undecorated Weaver Northeastern style caboose. I walled over the inner 2 windows to make it look more like an N5, spray painted it Columbia Gas Meter green (the Weirton Steel livery from the 1940s-1980s), applied home-made logo decals and dry transfer numbers, and heavily weathered the body and trucks to reflect years of service and neglect.

Coming in **third place** was the P&WV caboose by Jim Sacco (cover photo). He describes his model and what he did to it this

I have had two of these Life-Like Proto 2000 cabooses for almost thirty years and never taken them out of the box. I bought them because models lettered for the P&WV are rare. But I finally realized that it might be nice to do something with them since they aren't doing me much good in the boxes. Before I started this project, I would always drool over these nice models in their semi-assembled state (which was how they came). Doing the simple final assembly of putting the body on the chassis and adding rear handrails wasn't quite as easy as I expected.

First, the wheels wouldn't turn because they had copper wipers for lighting and the brake shoes rubbed the wheels. That required removing the wipers and adjusting the separate brakes. That greatly improved the rolling ability. Secondly, I didn't like the plasticky gray color the interior was molded in, so I painted it a pale green. That was after it took me a long time to break apart the cement joints holding everything together. Adding knuckle couplers was another project because it came with hook-horn couplers back then. It took a lot of filing and fitting to enlarge the coupler pockets to accept Kadee couplers. Then, I discovered that the cupola didn't sit right because the window glass hit the interior wall when you assembled it. More cutting and fitting. Finally, many of the detail parts are molded in a bright shiny engineering plastic. The grab irons were just too yellowy. So after I got everything together, I sprayed it with a matte clear coat and then tried to tone everything down with chalk and pastel powder weathering.

Minutes

June 27, 2021 Business Meeting

Superintendent Frank Benders opened the June general division meeting precisely at 2:30 PM.

He reported that Raymond Yurkowski, husband of Monica Yurkowski and son-in-law of Marge Meehan had passed away last week and asked us all to keep Marge and Monica in our thoughts.

He thanked Dennis Coglianese for hosting the meeting via Zoom.

Pass the Hat: Andy Blenko reported that he had no way to know what has been contributed and that Jeff Gregg would have a better idea. Jeff Gregg indicated that two checks for \$10 each had recently come in, the annual Zoom subscription was paid up, and that year-to-date the Division had received a dozen contributions.

New members and / or guests: Frank recognized our presenter, Doug Sandmeyer from Division 12 in Lakewood, NY. Doug models in a variety of scales, primarily On30 and On3. Frank also welcomed David Grounds, a transplanted Californian who recently joined the division as a result of his friendship with Patrick Altdorfer. He lives in Economy Borough. He is interested in FreeMo and models the Illinois Central, the Monon, and the Southern Pacific. David is originally from the Indianapolis, IN area, where he lived along the PRR mainline. So he may be modeling the Pennsy as well. Welcome!

Dennis Vaccaro proposed accepting the minutes of the May meeting as published in *Keystone Flyer* online. Susan Werner seconded the motion which was approved unanimously by acclamation.

Committee Reports:

Flyer: Patrick Altdorfer reported that the *Keystone Flyer* will be taking a holiday in July and that the submission deadline for the next issue has been extended an extra week. That will be July 11. He also indicated that the marketplace (member buy / sell advertisements) has seen little to no usage.

Treasurer: Jeff Gregg reported that the division is solvent. He also has received two differing space confirmations for the July Greenberg show, but nothing regarding the NMRA recruitment table....

Programs: Frank reminded everyone that there will be no meeting in July, in keeping with the Division's usual summer schedule and that the August meeting would take place, hopefully, at the picnic in Henle Park in Leetsdale. George Pandelios interjected that he had seen John Gallagher recently and inquired as to the status of the park permit with the Borough of Leetsdale. Free-Mo: Patrick Altdorfer reported that the Free-Mo application for the July 25-26 Greenberg Show had been tentatively accepted and that the group may again combine its layout with that of the South Hills Model Railroad Club at this show. Patrick is also expecting that the Free-Mo group will participate in the November Greenberg show. Further discussion ensued.

Bring-N-Brag: Tracy Boyd was not present, but her back-up Rich Terek presented the results.

Video Library: Bud Brock was not present, so no report.

Achievement Program: Dennis Vaccaro reported that he is waiting to hear from Frank at Regional for the Dispatching award and at least 3 members on working on certificates.

T-Trak: Richie Jodon was not present, but Jimmy Braum presented his report, including details of his expectations for the July Greenberg Show, including 21 of his own modules and another 15 from the members who are expecting to attend; the name tags he made for last year's summer show, Mike DeSensi's 24" x 48" portable layout, a Star-Wars themed module, and various aspects of T-Trak and N-scale modeling. He asked members to check out the Facebook page and "Like" it.

Frank reported that he intends to promote the 2022 Tri-Regional Convention at the Greenberg show. He inquired as to the availability of an easel. Dennis asked about promoting the 2023 Convention at Greenberg; Frank indicated no plans to do so as that may be too far in advance. Certainly it will be promoted at the 2022 Tri-Regional event.

MCR 2023 Convention: Keith DeVault was not present so there was no report.

Old Business: There was no old business.

<u>New Business:</u> Because of the Leetsdale Borough's reluctance to open Henle Park, Frank raised the issue of finding an alternative site for the picnic, remembered that Susan mentioned a park used in the past, which Dennis remembered as Goehring Park in West Newton, PA. 
meeting will follow at around 2:30pm. The Bring-n-Brag category is Passenger Cars.

AUTUMN 2021 OUTLOOK




September 19: Wexford, PA | "Capturing the Commonwealth"

Our September meeting will be hosted at the Marshall Township Municipal Building, which Neal Schorr has again coordinated for us. After the meeting, Neal will present "Capturing the Commonwealth," his clinic that focuses on how he accurately reproduced PRR's Middle Division across central Pennsylvania as well as providing an update on the progress he made on the railroad during the pandemic. The presentation will explain how both an understanding of the topography and geology of the region as well knowledge about the physical plant of the railroad were essential to his goal of accurately modeling the railroad. The clinic includes many comparison images of the prototype railroad and the model, and wraps up with an artistic segment which highlights the beautiful scenery of the region which prompted him to model the Middle Division.

The <u>layout</u> (115 Hilltop Lane, Wexford, PA 15090) will open at **12 noon** and will **close promptly at 2 PM** so Neal can set up the clinic at the Marshall Township Municipal building. He will reopen the layout after the meeting to those who were unable to see it earlier. Note: Hilltop Lane is a private road with no place to park, so please park on Vander Road and walk back to the house and down the driveway.

The <u>meeting site</u> is the Marshall Township Municipal Building (located at 525 Pleasant Hill Road, Wexford, PA 15090) and is roughly five minutes from my house. It will be open from 1:30pm. The entrance to the meeting room is on the lower level from the rear parking lot.


September Preview: "Capturing the Commonwealth"
