



First Place went to Jim Hofer for a trio of Penn Central equipment (photomontage right). Jim's entry included PC caboose 18404, Russel Snowplow PC 60251, and 120-ton Brownhoist Crane PC X34. The caboose was a 'basket case' from the flea market bin with many scavenged parts from the parts box. Jim noted that this was his last piece of equipment painted with Floquil paints. The snowplow was an old Walthers (now Atlas) painted to resemble one found in Morning Sun's PC Freight Car & Passenger book. The crane is a former Dimi Trains (now Tichy Train Group) kit.



Second Place went to Jimmy Braum for a buffer hopper (photo above). Jimmy noted the prototype is still in service on Norfolk Southern. The model is weathered with numerous coats of Dullcote and various weathering powders. The rusting effect is achieved by using the 'hair spray' method. Jimmy describes it as first a layer of rust colored paint followed by a shot of hair spray – the cheaper the better. The hair spray dissolves the paint, and it looks like peeling paint.

Third Place went to Bob DiBenedetto for his Norfolk & Western transfer caboose entry (center right), which he simply weathered with various chalks.

For display only, David Newell (formerly of Atlas Tool Company) brought this sample that was sent to Atlas for the first run of their RS-1 model (bottom).







WORKIN' ON THE RAILROAD



by Steven Schorr

I recently found myself living in Eastern Pennsylvania after accepting a job offer at the Reading, Blue Mountain & Northern as a conductor. On my second day conducting on my own, I am aboard the northbound "North Reading Fast Freight", the turn job from North Reading to Pittston and return.

Center: A car that dad and I have wanted a model of for a long time is the Reading's very late-purchased HTG class hopper. With most being built in late 1975, the cars essentially spent their whole lives under the ownership of Conrail, and a few even survived into the NS era. Nobody has ever made a correct O scale model of these cars, so I took it upon myself to paint and decal a few. These were CSX painted

cars that I wet-sanded the lettering off of before apply a thin coat of Tamiya's rattle can semi-gloss black to restore an even finish. The decals are from K4.

Below: Here is a side-by-side comparison of my N scale model of the town of Nesbit, PA and the prototype. I have been working on making my own PRR position signals as I haven't been satisfied with any on the market. I use Shapeways to have them 3D printed in resin, and I install 0402 LEDs inside the



rear light housings. The signal head in this scene is just my prototype sitting loosely on top of the bridge, I am still perfecting the design before I make the 16 signal heads that I need!

Division Two Modular Railroads at Greenberg

Division Two impresses again at the Greenberg Train Show

The Division Two modular railroad groups, Free-Mo (HO scale) and T-Trak (N scale) fielded two layouts at the July Greenberg Train Show at Monroeville Convention Center, the weekend of 23-24 July. A nice turnout of layouts showed up to this (typically) low public turnout event. Nonetheless, I think everyone who took part had a good time — or at least they are good actors, because it seemed that everyone was enjoying themselves. I managed to get an almost "aerial" view of the Division Two sponsored layouts on Sunday before the show ended, but we begin with a panorama view of the joint Division Two Free-Mo (*foreground and left*) and South Hills Model Railroad Club (*loop at right beyond the Wye*).





This is probably the seventh time that our Free-Mo group created a joint layout with the South Hills Model Railroad Club at the Greenberg Show. Both of us built our modules to the Free-Mo standards, more or less (some more less than more!). The SHMRRC layout is typically an oval, and we use a Wye module to build our branch line off of that and see what we can do. This time, we used my icehouse branch to route trains to the loop (*left*).
