


### **Tunnel Sliders for Spiders**


The Turtle Creek Railroad (HO scale) has some hard-to-reach track in tunnels, and there are tiny spiders who get into the tunnels to spin their webs. So Tom Frommeyer and I designed and 3-D printed underframes for track-cleaning cars to be run between operating sessions. The 40-ft car underframe (pictured top right) has truck bolsters, guides for coupler pockets, and a pair of brackets to guide the cleaning pad holder (pictured bottom right). The guides keep the pad holder centered under the car while permitting it to ride up and down a little so it doesn't snag the track. The pad holder has two posts used to install Woodland Scenics tidy track cleaning pads that slide along under the car on the rails. We put a regular metal freight car weight on top of the underframe, and two thicknesses on top of the cleaning pad holder. We run several of these in a work train with different kinds of cleaning pads and our favorite cleaning solution. You can download the Stereolithographic(STL) file from the <a href="Division Two website here">Division Two website here</a> if you would like to print some for yourself.



The files "CleanerCar.stl" (top left) and "PadHolder2.stl" (bottom left) are images that represent the Stereo Lithographic files that you can use with a



slicer to 3-D print the underframe and the cleaning pad components of the car. Download these files from the Keystone Division website (navigate to link above).

What's on your workbench-Ken Hanawalt presented his new track cleaning car it looked great and please talk to him about his invention.



The Mid-Eastern Region's annual conventions rotate throughout the MER so that each geographic area will have a nearby convention on a regular basis. The host areas are North Carolina or Southern Virginia, Washington DC, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Eastern New Jersey. Pennsylvania is the selected area for our 2023 convention with the Susquehanna Division 11 as host.

The previous two conventions held in Pennsylvania were in King of Prussia and in Harrisburg. We wanted to find a host city that was farther to the west, and it was not difficult to identify Altoona as an ideal place to hold this convention. A very successful MER convention was held there in 2000. In 2000, the host hotel was the Altoona Sheridan which is now called the Altoona Grand Hotel under its new management. It was again selected as the host hotel for our 2023 convention.

Jerry Lauchle, MMR was appointed chairman of the Local Convention Committee (LCC) in February 2022. Jerry plans to attend the MCR Convention we are hosting in Cranberry this May, on Friday and Saturday, to present information about their plans for Altoona 2023. ### Dirt, the NNRY's "King of the Shop" (2008-2023)

His name was "Dirt" — and that is no insult, he earned the name....
He was born in the locomotive repair shop of the Northern Nevada Railway Museum, beneath an historic steam locomotive. According to the NNRY, "Dirt got his name because he loves to roll in the dirt in the back rooms of the engine house. He got his title "King of the Shop" because he carried out his role as official greeter and mascot in such a regal way."

Last month, at the middle age of 15, Dirt passed away unexpectedly. He had lived his whole life amidst the coal and soot of a



working locomotive repair facility and yard. His "co-workers" in the shop report that he would hang around with them as they performed their tasks, and he was "unflustered by the routine noises in the shop as the machinery operates. The shop was his home, and all that he really knew." I guess this means that he was no scaredy-cat!

As his passing was noted on the <u>NNRY website</u> and <u>Facebook pages</u>, tributes poured in from around the world, a testament to how beloved he was around the world, to the many visitors to the NNRY Shops over the past 15 years got to know him as one of the living faces of the preservation work that is done there. He leaves a legacy of fond memories of those who had known him all these years, or who had visited or worked in the shops of this heritage railway, as well as those who had visited only virtually online.

To honor this legacy and to commemorate his life, the NNRY is raising funds to commission a bronze statue to erect at his tombstone on the site, and they hope to dedicate it on May 28 of this year. You can find more information about Dirt here on the
