Editor's Model of the Month

Steve Ross brought three classic Rivarossi HO scale models from the 1970s to the Bring'n'Brag contest at our March meeting, including NYC #5446, a 4-8-4 Hudson locomotive whose streamlined shroud was designed by Henry Dreyfuss and applied to the class J-3a locomotives in 1937-38. Steve enhanced this model substantially: he added window "glass," installed Kadee couplers, painted the frame and trucks, and added the pinstriping decals on the tender. He did similar detailing to the non-streamlined #5405, and he painted and decalled the B&O switcher engine (for photos see page 7). He told the editor at the RPM Meet last month in Youngwood that this has been his favorite locomotive since he was a young'un. From the Super's Desk

In my Februrary column, I wrote about the problem of member retention. While we are gaining new members, we are losing existing members at the same rate. While there can be

many reasons members don't renew their membership, I've seen some evidence that new members find it difficult to engage with existing members when they attend events or meetings. This can happen with existing members as well as members.

George Pandelios, Ken Hanawalt and I have been working on some ways we can address this problem and announced some new programs at the March Meeting.

To help new members break the ice, we want to create at least 3 **New Member Ambassadors**. We would like to have one in the Pittsburgh area, one in the Steubenville area and another in the West Virginia area. Each of these ambassadors would communicate with new members during their first year and help arrange contact with existing and other new members in their area who have similar modeling interests. We're hoping that this can be done with informal meetings, which can be layout visits or other sharing opportunities at either the existing or new members' home. There could also be meetings at a coffee shop or restaurant. Contact via phone or e-mail would be used but the goal is to help create personal connections that are valuable to both parties.

While this program will help new members, we want to create more value for existing members. At our monthly meetings, we usually have some form of clinic but we'd like to create more opportunities for members to share/receive information. We'd like to identify members who can serve as **Mentors** to other members.

A **Mentor** would be willing to share information about a topic at small gatherings in their home. This doesn't have to be a clinic type presentation but an informal gathering and discussion. It also doesn't have to be with someone who knows it all presenting it to others who want to learn. It could be a discussion among a group of members who are trying to learn more about some aspect of the hobby.

The key is to have members gather to learn and share. We all have a common interest in model railroading, but it is a meal that is best shared to the benefit of all.

March 16, 2025 Business Meeting

The March Division Meeting was called to order by Superintendent Dennis Coglianese at 2:30 p.m. at the Mon Valley Railroad Historical Society in Morgantown, West Virginia. Richard Turton, President of the Society spoke on behalf of the society thanking all in attendance, and be sure to see the upgraded Layout Rooms with new Lights, Fans and Heaters. We had 41 members in attendance with no new members or guests for the meeting.

The February minutes were approved with one correction, that Kevin Squire is not T-Trak Committee Chair for the Division but for the Region, and with a motion by Jeff Gregg (seconded by George Pandelios) the correction was accepted and the revised minutes approved.

Committee Reports

Video Library: Bud Brock asked the membership how many use the NMRA Video Library and please try the library as the NMRA is trying to fix the link, which is down temporarily. No one at the meeting had used the site.

T-Trak Committee: Jimmy Braum said the T-Trak Modules would be setting up with the Division at the Regional Convention in Columbus on May 15-18. Judging for your module will be available if you want it to be judged.

Jamboree: Grier Kuehn thanked Tom Gaus for keeping everything up to date on the website, the Clinics are posted. Grier spoke about the Jamboree being a recruitment tool for the Division to get new members and about the 9-month rail pass that is available to join the NMRA. Today the registration stands at 26 with 25 members and 1 new member with 16 banquets paid for as of this date. He thanked George Pandelios and Neal Schorr for all their hard work in helping to promote this event. George has been posting meeting and Jamboree notices on the O-Gauge Railroading (OGR) Forum. <u>Concerns and Questions</u>: It was brought up about bad weather for this region for meetings and whether we could do zoom meetings. Superintendent Coglianese spoke about this situation and as of right now, that cannot happen because of the meetings are held in different locations with no WI-FI. He would welcome the idea if it could be worked out.

For the Good of the Division: Steve Ross talked about the Railroad Prototype Modelers Meet to be held at the Westmoreland Community College in Youngwood, PA on March 21st and March 22nd. He announced that 38 clinics have been scheduled along with 20 vendors with a total of 43 tables. There will also be Operating Sessions on Thursday afternoon and Thursday Evening at various layouts in the area. This is sponsored by our division and the event has 196 people registered. The March Bring 'n' Brag category was Motive Power: Steam. We had four entries this month:



Rick Montgomery won first place for his weathered HO scale C&O #494, a 4-8-2 Mountain locomotive from Mehano with a combine (Vanderbilt) tender, which Rick decalled and then weathered using powders (ash grey, soot black, and rust).



Second Place went to Tom Catalano, for his Monogram plastic model kit (HO scale) of Chessie #312, a 4-6-4 Hudson locomotive, which he custom painted and applied some "very old" decals.



The **third place** winner was **Mike DeSensi**, who entered his Bachmann N scale model of a Class EM1 locomotive, B&O #7602, an EM1 (aka 2-8-8-4 Yellowstone from Baldwin), which he weathered demurely with an airbrush.

The fourth entrant was **Steve Ross**, who brought a beautiful trio of old time power: two NYC J3a Hudsons — the classic #5446 (on the cover) and its "less pretty" sister #5405 — and B&O #99, an 0-4-0 switcher engine and tender (both below). All of these are Rivarossi HO scale models from the 1970s, which he detailed to a high standard: to the Hudsons he added Kadee couplers,



window "glass," and painted various components and added decals; he painted and decalled the switcher engine. Steve also displayed these models at the RPM Meet in Youngwood in March.




<u>From points east or west</u>: Take US Route 22 to Monroeville, turn north onto Haymaker Road, continue onto Beatty Road;

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


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2025 JAMBOREE NEWS

Facility Map

This year's Jamboree will again be held at the Boyce Campus of Community College of Allegheny County, Monroeville, PA. In order to minimize confusion, below you will find diagrams of the facility. Take a few minutes to study the maps in order to familiarize yourself with the layout of the school.

As you drive into the campus, the South Entrance door will be immediately in front of you. You can park in either lot on either side of the entrance road, then enter the building using the South Entrance door as noted on the diagram below. You will be on the fifth floor. Turn to your right and walk down the hall to the registration desk. Once you register, you can proceed down the hall to the Student Union where breakfast will be served. RPM-EAST 2025 A SUCCESS

The Railroad Prototype Modelers (East) Meet in March 2025 seemed to go off without a hitch, in the eyes of the editor (who could only make the Saturday session, unfortunately). This event is sponsored by Division Two, and several or our members were in attendance at the event, and some are driving forces behind this event, including **Steve Ross** and **Don Coulter**, to name just two.

Among the 35+ clinicians who presented at the event were several Keystone Division members, including Jimmy Braum, Kent Colvin, Keith DeVault, Denny Lippert, George Pandelios, Neal Schorr, and Roy Ward. Attendees hailed from all over the country, and I believe that I heard that there was at least one attendee from Canada.



Among the models on display were several interesting O scale locomotives and rolling stock models (left, center left, and below) from **Erik Fritzberg**, who has also entered his models in the Bring'n' Brag and Jamboree contests last year; here are a few images of the models he brought to RPM. I believe that the B&O E7 in

"Beauty" Scheme (below left) is the same brass locomotive that Erik brought to the February meeting (see March Flyer, p. 9), which at that time had not yet been painted. It lives up to its moniker.















An AeroTrain of the PRR in HO scale, by Railworks Brass models (left; modeler unknown).



Alongside his two NYC Hudsons and B&O switcher engine, **Steve Ross** displayed West Penn Railways Interurban streetcar #736 (HO scale), a model he kitbashed from two Brill trolleys (Bachmann) for operation on the Youngwood Model RR Club layout. He added Champ decals but sourced the Herald and end signs from a primary source (book image, photocopied and reduced).

A few attendees displayed convincing loads, made out of seemingly random items (such as cardboard packaging like cereal box sides to make loads of sheet steel). **Jason Mauser** showed his scrap glass loads, which looked an awful lot like the prototype — after using foam to form the basic shape of the load for his N scale hoppers, he covered that with paint and glitter to achieve the iridescent effect.

Rob Bennett presented a clinic on creating transformer loads; in the model room, he displayed a variety of transformers and provided a history of their components, construction, and transport modalities over time, so that modelers can avoid anachronisms.








There were also some well done structures in various scales (mostly HO), but two of the most impressive ones (in my view) were these N scale offerings: **Steve Holzheimer** brought his General Tire factory (top) with prototype information on the Akron facility), including the spitting image of its headquarters building; and **Ken Stroebel** brought his model of the Sherwin-Williams paint factory in Garland, Texas (bottom). Both presented a comprehensive rendering of these industrial sites (compared to the prototype photos they each provided of their respective doppelgangers).

This modeler (name not displayed) showed an in-progress Howe Truss Pontoon Bridge and Pier and Apron Approach (bottom), based on CNJ and B&O prototypes (photos at right), which they are scratch-building for their home layout, using Mt. Albert scale



lumber, 3d prints of NBWs, tie plates, bollards, and cleats from Gotham Rail & Marine (who had a table in the vendor room), as well as Peco bumpers and Micro-Engineering C83 rail.

Increasingly popular in the hobby, T-Trak modules made an appearance at the event as well. Here in the model room, **Jason Mauser** set up three of the modules he built for the Iron City N Scalers club, to which several other members of Division Two also belong. His glass scrap hoppers can be seen in the trains on the perimeter (on the table, four in each cut of cars outside of the module.





Steve Raque brought several cuts of HO scale cars that he weathered to appear to have been pretty beaten-up while serving their respective industries, such as the Kling cars that worked the steel mills, the 2- and 3-bay covered hoppers of P&LE that look as though they worked cement plants, and the myriad tank cars in the background that served myriad industries.

Scooter Hovenal

brought a fleet of locomotives and rolling stock that were heavily weathered; they looked to represent more or less the modern era, from the midto late 1990s and onward, based on the age of the cars and the amount of graffiti.



Unfortunately there was no prototype photo to accompany this model, which **Rick Blackford** brought for display in the model room. Advertising on the outside of freight and tank cars is not new, of course, but what struck me was that this tank car was also tapped, surely a violation of the FRA's strict rules prohibiting trackside alcohol use by railroad employees. Nonetheless, it is making me thirsty now, so that's all she wrote for this issue!
